Chinese Mystery Snails Identification Card



Scientific Name: Cipangopaludina chinensis

Description: Chinese mystery snails are part of the Viviparidae family, meaning that they have live births (vs. laying eggs). Adult snails can reach up to 70mm shell length. Typically, Chinese mystery snails are light brown to dark drown and sometimes almost black. Their shells have 6 to 8 whorls and an operculum (trap door) which is a shell feature that seals the shell shut.

Habitat Preference: Freshwater ponds, lakes, wetlands, and slow moving rivers with mucky bottoms, gravel, or rocky areas where there is an abundance of organic matter and zooplankton.

Feeding Mechanism: Primarily grazers, adults 40mm and larger can filter feed.
